

PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDING AVAILABILITY ISSUED BY THE NYS OFFICE OF COMMUNITY RENEWAL, HELD ON WEDNESDAY, MAY 4, 2011, AT 6:00 P.M. AT THE VILLAGE OF LYONS OFFICE, 76 WILLIAM STREET, LYONS, NEW YORK.

Mayor Kleisle asked that everyone present stand for the pledge to the flag.

Mayor Kleisle asked the Clerk-Treasurer to read the legal notice and the affidavit of posting was presented.

Mayor Kleisle explained the Village of Lyons is in the process of applying for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for replacement of the century-old waterlines located on or adjacent to Montezuma Street. The amount of the application we would apply for is \$600,000.

Mayor Kleisle noted on the preliminary cost sheet, item I-14 Asphalt Pavement Replacement for \$65,000 would be removed. The Village will be paving the entire street using CHIPS money.

Mayor Kleisle then opened the public hearing for questions and comments from the Village Board and public.

Jeff Deichman questioned what street was being considered. Mayor Kleisle replied, Montezuma Street. He then questioned if they were getting the same work done that Elmer Street did. He was told yes.

Rebecca Gamba, Director of Grants Development, reviewed the map of Montezuma Street. She explained where the new water lines would be placed.

Dan LaGasse questioned if the pavement will be milled. He was advised, yes it would. Mr. LaGasse also asked the deadline of the grant. May 27th the grant has to be mailed by.

Rebecca Gamba suggested the Village ask for a letter of support from the Lyons Fire Department and Canalview.

Mayor Kleisle stated the grant requirements state no one else can benefit from this, that is why Montezuma Street was selected.

Michael Salerno, General Working Foreman, stated house services would be replaced, fire hydrants would have increase pressure, valves would be replaced and the street would be milled down and a top coat would be put on it.

Jeff Deichman stated this has been very good for the people on Elmer Street and this would be nice for the residents on Montezuma Street.

There were no more comments.
